PRESS RELEASE COMISSION ON THE STATUS OF WOMEN



UN Women welcomes the adoption of robust blueprint to end women's poverty 22 MARCH 2024

The 68th session of the Commission on the Status of Women (CSW68) delivered today robust commitments by UN Member States to strengthen financing and institutions to eradicate women's and girls' poverty.

Globally, 10.3 per cent of women live in extreme poverty today, according to the report presented by the UN Secretary-General to the Commission, and progress towards ending poverty needs to be 26 times faster to achieve the Sustainable Development Goals by 2030.

The outcome document (or Agreed Conclusions) recognizes that women and girls living in poverty become 'shock absorbers' in times of crisis, and that further efforts are needed to increase resources to address women's and girls' poverty

Acknowledging that the international financial architecture is not fit for a crisis-prone world, the Commission called for reforms to enable countries to mobilize and invest resources in gender equality. These measures include debt relief and progressive taxation and ensuring that public resources are allocated to address the needs and rights of women and girls.

The Agreed Conclusions also recommend mobilizing financial resources from public and private sources, strengthening the international financial architecture, ensuring a gender lens in national budgeting processes, and preventing regressive taxation that disproportionately impacts women and girls with low or no income.

The outcome document also notes that official development assistance must be increased to address women's and girls' poverty.

The share of total aid with gender equality as a policy objective decreased for the first time in a decade from 45 in 2019 to 43 per cent in 2020, per the latest data of the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD).

Commission also called for the The implementation of gender-responsive economic and social policies, including increased representation, women's leadership and participation in economic enforcing institutions. core standards to ensure equal pay for work of equal value, and implementing policies to women-owned businesses. support **Engaging** financing and women's another organizations is key recommendation. Robust. flexible and multi-year financing for locally led feminist movements and women's organizations is critical to address poverty, as proven by existing mechanisms such as the UN Trust Fund to End Violence Against the Women's Peace and and Women Humanitarian Fund. The Agreed Conclusions also call to strengthen national capacities to collect and use disaggregated data on multidimensional poverty, and to adopt new development strategies towards economies. sustainable These include strengthening inclusive and genderresponsive social protection systems and scaling up investment in the care economy to reduce women's time and income poverty employment and expand their opportunities.

During the session, the Commission also adopted a resolution on HIV-AIDS led by the Southern Africa Development Community (SADC), which calls to increase investment in gender equality and the empowerment of all women and girls in the HIV-AIDS response.

CSW69 10TH TO 21ST MARCH 2025

The two-week session is the largest UN gathering on gender equality. CSW68 brought together world leaders – including two Heads of State, three vice-presidents and over 100 Ministers – and 4,800 representatives of civil-society organizations, marking the second-highest attendance in CSW records.

On the sidelines of CSW68, approximately 270 side events were organized by UN States. Member intergovernmental organizations and UN entities; and more than 760 parallel events were organized by civil society and youth-led organizations as part of the NGO CSW68 Forum.The participation of young people, including girls, adolescent across the various sessions, including the Youth Forum, enabled youth delegates to exchange experiences, knowledge, lessons learned and good practices with an emphasis on the multiple dimensions of inequality which exacerbate how young women and girls experience poverty. The sessions, particularly the Youth Interactive Dialogue, demonstrated the importance of continuing with the practice of integrating critical youth perspectives in the official sessions of the CSW.Attention is now turning to next year's 30th anniversary of the adoption of the Beijing Platform for Action. The 69th session of the Commission on the Status of Women (CSW69) will take place from 10 to 21 March 2025 in New York. 7

Retired former deputy chief of staff of the Liberian Armed Forces, Brigadier General Geraldine Janet George has been appointed by President Joseph Boakai as Acting minister of defence.

General Janet George was appointed on February 12th after her predecessor retired Major Prince Charles Johnson II resigned following a protest by military wives in Monrovia over Low salaries and poor living conditions of their families in military barracks.

General George who becomes the first female to serve as minister of defence in Liberia has served in various capacities within the Armed Forces of Liberia (AFL), including acting commander, military police company commander, deputy chief of staff and legal officer. She has also participated in peacekeeping missions in Mali as part of the United Nations Multidimensional Integrated Stabilization Mission in Mali (MINUSMA).

She holds a Master of Arts degree in International Relations from Webster University in the United States and a Bachelor of Arts degree in Criminal Justice from the African Methodist Episcopal Zion University College in Liberia's capital, Monrovia. The retired brigadier-general is also trained in intelligence, counter-terrorism, public sector management and administration of justice from institutions in Liberia, Sierra Leone and Italy.



ACCESS BANK NAMES FIRST FEMALE CEO

Boladji Agbede Has been named acting Group Chief Executive Officer of Access Bank Group. She succeeds the late Herbert Wigwe who died in a helicopter crash

Agbede whose appointment has approved by the Central Bank of Nigeria holds 27 years in the banking sector with extensive expertise in human resource management, customer relationship management, and banking operations. She commenced her professional career in Guaranty Trust Bank and served in various capacities including Relationship Manager Vault Custodian. She diligently distinguished herself and swiftly rose from the grade of Executive Trainee in 1992 to Manager in 2001. Ms. Agbede subsequently served as the Chief Executive Officer of JKG limited in 2003 a business consulting outfit.

Ms. Agbede has journeyed to the top of Access Bank which she joined in 2003 as an Assistant General Manager responsible for managing the Bank's portfolio of chemical trading companies. She has also occupied sveral roles in the company including human resource Director since 2010. She holds a bachelors degree in Mathematics and Statistics from the University of Lagos (1990) and an MBA from Cranfield University (2002). There are many challenges and nothing will be achieved easily

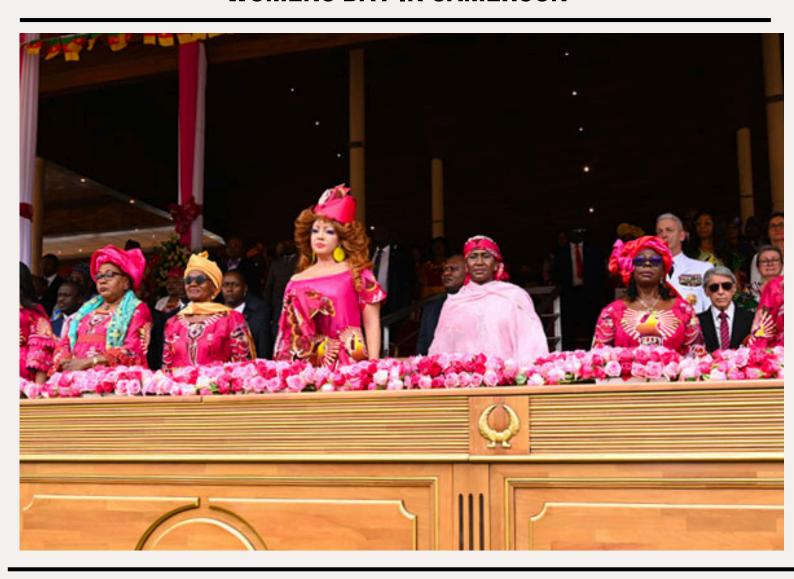
Together we will be stronger!

THE HISTORY AND IMPORTANCE OF INTERNATIONAL WOMENS DAY IN CAMEROON



Every march 8th, more than 20,000 cameroonian women from rural and urban areas converge on the Nations political capital Yaoundé to parade before the first lady of the Republic of Cameroon Mrs. Chantal Biya.

At the level of the regional headquarters ,the Governors and their wives also preside over similar parades. However, so many women who take part in these parades do not know the origin of International womens Day in Cameroon and why this day is significant. Here are some basic facts every Cameroonian woman should know about International Women's Day in Cameroon.

HAPPY 39TH INTERNATIONAL WOMENS DAY 2024

Cameroon started participating officially in the activities of the women day celebration at the 1985 conference in Nairobi, which was a follow-up appraise and review the works of the United Nations decade for Women (United Nations 1985). On the International Day of the Woman therefore women are called to reflect on the twelve platforms of the Beijing declaration through a theme which is always suggested by the United Nations Women. The uniqueness of the Women's Day celebration in Cameroon is the solidarity in stitching a unique fabric and one can only hope that this solidarity would cut across all walks of life; from politics to the economy through agriculture, technology and education.

CAMEROONIAN FINANCIAL TRANSACTIONS PLATFORM KOREE RAISES \$200,000 IN PRE-SEED FUNDING TO EXPAND ITS TERRITORY.

The amount was raised with the lead support of Nigerian fintech Duplo and other investors, including private Angels Network, Catalytic Cameroon Africa, and Digital Africa. This capital is expected to enable Koree, founded by Cameroonian Magalie Gauze-Sanga, to support its expansion on the continent, particularly in French-speaking Africa. According to the CEO, Korée plans to use these funds to expand its network of marketers, expand its user base, and adapt the product to the market.

Koree is preparing to launch a new marketplace, which will allow users to retain rewards on their daily purchases. Its founder claims that consumers will now earn money when they shop on the application in 14 categories ranging from bakeries to supermarkets, fast food, cinema, and pharmacies. "They shop as usual and earn a certain percentage of the amount they spent. The money that Koree users earn in their wallet is cash that they can exchange directly into their mobile money account," Magalie Gauze-Sanga explained.

This digital solution, accessible on iOS and Android, was designed to solve the problem of currency shortages in French-speaking Africa.



Since its launch in 2022. Koree claims to have already registered more than 13,000 users, processed more than 50,000 cash transactions for a total amount of \$400,000 (more than 240 million FCFA at the current value of the US dollar). The fintech also claims to have created 30,000 digital wallets since its inception. Winner of the Ecobank Fintech Challenge and the Orange Fab Cameroon Challenge in 2023, Koree has an established team in Cameroon, Senegal, Ivory Coast, Togo and Nigeria, and plans to open a physical office in Cameroona economic capital Douala.

The forward-thinking woman king-HER MAJESTY THE QUEEN OF BATANGA

Michèle Gaëlle Mahouve IV is a lone female paramount traditional ruler in Cameroon who became the first Queen of the Batanga Lohove group of the coastal region after 100 years. She was designated by the Council of Notables of the BATANGA LOHOVE Group as legitimate successor to the throne during the funeral of her late parents who passed away following a ghastly motor accident.

The frontline humanitarian and cultural activist dedicates her time to empowering children and youths to reclaim their cultural heritage. Through activities like theatre and dance, which she coordinates herself, children and young people of her clan within the age of 7 to 30 have gained knowledge and skills which they can use to expound on the cultural prowess of the BATANGA LOHOVE Group.

A strong believer that cross-cultural collaboration is a strength of the African people her majesty Queen MAHOUVE IV has been seen actively participating in cross-cultural activities beyond BATANGA since her enthronement

On the sidelines of her cultural activities, she is also an engaged humanitarian who is deeply concerned about the well-being of vulnerable women and children, especially orphans. Over the years, she has provided food items and medication to these groups of people in Batanga and beyond. She specifically purchases and parcels presents for children in orphanages during festive seasons.

Queen MAHOUVE IV is also a professional magistrate who doubles as the head of the litigation unit in the Division of Legal Affairs and Consumer Protection of the Telecommunications Regulatory Agency (TRB).

In 2020, Dr.Sakah was hired within the framework of the UN Women and the Ministry of Women Empowerment and the Family project dubbed "Second Chance Education project" as a consultant to facilitate the implementation of activities related to the implications of gender based violence in the Far North, Adamawa, and East Regions of Cameroon.

As Focal Person for the Centre Region during implementation of the project on "Building community action to end violence against women and girls in Cameroon" initiated by the ministry of Women Empowerment and the Family he spearheaded the organisation of 2 workshops for over 150 service providers, traditional rulers, religious authorities, police officers, municipal authorities, lawyers, medical personnel, and survivors of gender based violence in the Centre Region of Cameroon.

He has also successfully organised sensitization campaigns, reaching out to hundreds of women and youth on policy related issues and civic responsibility.

As the Managing Director of Big Steps outreach Network {BONET-Cameroon he has coordinated the implementation of several projects geared towards improving the status of women in society inclusing the SHE platform-BONET project 50/50 which provides micro loans to women from the trouble stricken North West and South West Regions to start up buisness.

He holds a Phd. in Governance and Regional Intergration from the Pan African university insitute of Governance, Humanities and Social Sciences and the University of Yaoundé ll Soa , Masters in Governance and Regional Integration and a Bachelor of Science degree in sociology and anthropology from the University of Buea and has written over 15 research articles.







WOMEN WING OF THE SOCIAL DEMOCRATIC FRONT PARTY STRATEGIZES AHEAD OF 2025 ELECTIONS



The women's wing of one of Cameroon's main opposition political parties SDF, has met to discuss innovative fundraising strategies to support female candidates running for political office in the 2025 municipal and legislative elections.

During the meeting in Cameroon's political capital Yaoundé on Friday, February 16th chaired by Dr Haoua Madeleine, the women discussed ways of advancing the women's agenda within the party.

In her opening statement, Dr Madeleine highlighted the increase in the number of women in the SDF as one of the meeting's priorities "We are here to strategize on how we can bring more women into the SDF" she said

She used the occasion to convince women who are not involved in politics to join the Social Democratic Front party. When quizzed on the calibre of women who can join, the former senator opined that there are no particular criteria to become a politician. "Politics is not just for the powerful, we all have needs, and ideas on how we want the country to evolve, and that is why we are calling on people on all levels to join the SDF and see how they can change the nation with their ideas" she explained.

The Republic of Cameroon is set to host the municipal, legislative and presidential elections in 2025.

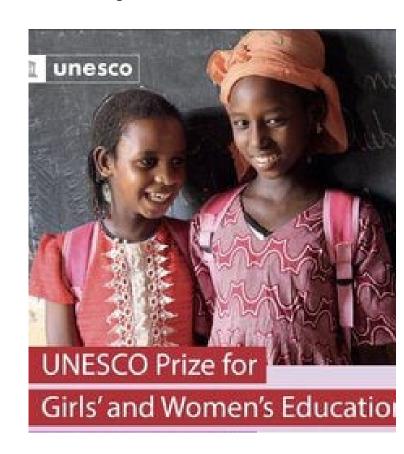
Unesco prize for girls

Applications are now open for the 2024 UNESCO Prize for Girls' and Women's Education. The UNESCO Prize for Girls' and Women's Education honours outstanding and innovative contributions made by institutions. individuals. and organizations to advance girls' and women's education. It is the first UNESCO Prize of this nature and is unique in showcasing successful projects that improve and promote the educational prospects of girls and women and in turn, the quality of their lives.

Funded by the Government of the People's Republic of China, the Prize is conferred annually to two laureates and consists of an award of US \$50,000 each to help further their work in the area of girls' and women's education. The Director-General of UNESCO awarded the Prize for the first time in 2016.

Nomination Procedure:

Governments of UNESCO Member States via their Permanent Delegations to UNESCO and Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs) in official partnership with UNESCO can make up to 3 nominations. Self-nominations are not accepted.
